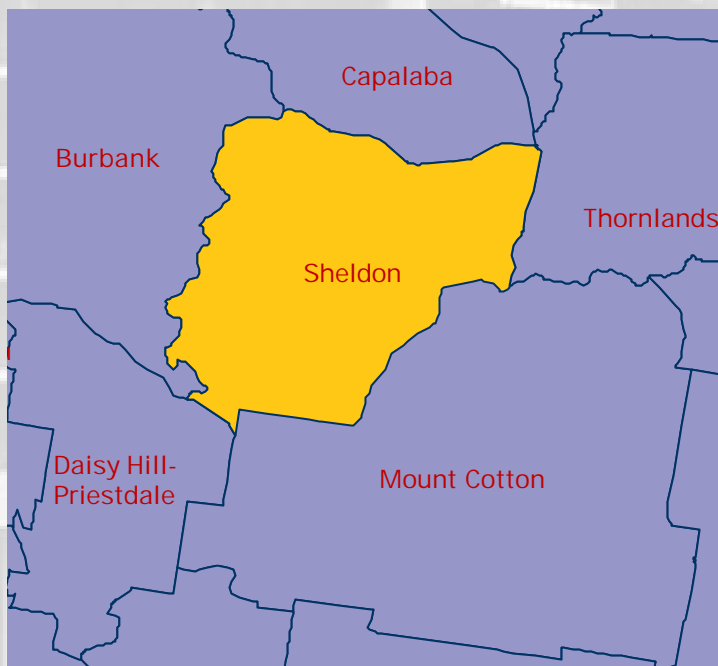

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Key Points

- The estimated resident population of Sheldon at 30 June 2001 was 1,882 people, representing an increase of 77 people or 0.8% per annum since 1996.
- The number of young people (0-14 years) increased by 0.8% from 375 people at the 30th June 1996 to 378 people at the 30th June 2001.
- The number of older people (65 years and over) decreased by 1.7% from 117 people at the 30th June 1996 to 115 people at the 30th June 2001.
- The number of 'working age' people (15-64 years) increased by 5.9% from 1,313 people at the 30th June 1996 to 1,390 people at the 30th June 2001.



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Note:

Unless otherwise indicated, data are sourced from Australian Bureau of Statistics, Census of Population and Housing. Australian Bureau of Statistics unpublished data have been used in Tables 1, 2, 3, 4, 16, 18 and 23. Where boundary changes have occurred PIFU has calculated figures for past Censuses by splitting Collection Districts. Numbers may not add exactly due to rounding.

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Introduction

This DEMOGRAPHIC profile provides an analysis of the first release tables from the 2001 Census of Population and Housing Basic Community Profile as well as additional unpublished census data, the latest population and building approval figures. The current DEMOGRAPHIC profile will be expanded upon when the second release tables become available in November 2002. The expanded profile will include analysis of the second release tables (which include information on the labour force, industries, occupations, income and qualifications), as well as information from other sources including the Department's purchase of special customised tables.

DEMOGRAPHIC profiles are available for areas throughout Queensland, including Local Government Areas, Statistical Local Areas (suburbs), urban centres, towns and postcodes. A profile can also be designed to provide a comparison between an area (e.g. Local Government Area) and its respective region (e.g. Statistical Division) or between a number of areas (e.g. All Local Government Areas in a Statistical Division).

Population change

- On Census night (7 August 2001), 1,796 people were counted in Sheldon, representing an increase of 49 people or 0.6% per annum since the 1996 Census.
- The estimated resident population of Sheldon at 30 June 2001 was 1,882 people, representing an increase of 77 people or 0.8% per annum since 1996.
- In comparison, Queensland's average annual growth rate in the 1996 to 2001 period was 1.7%.

Census counts: Number of people counted in an area on Census night. Census counts include usual residents who were at home, as well as visitors from elsewhere in Australia or from overseas. Australian residents elsewhere in Australia or temporarily overseas at the time of the Census are excluded from the area.

Estimated resident population: Number of people estimated to be usual residents of an area. Census count is adjusted to exclude people not usually resident in the area and include people usually resident who were elsewhere on Census night. Further adjustments take into account Census under-enumeration and persons who usually reside in the area but were temporarily overseas on Census night.

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Age profile

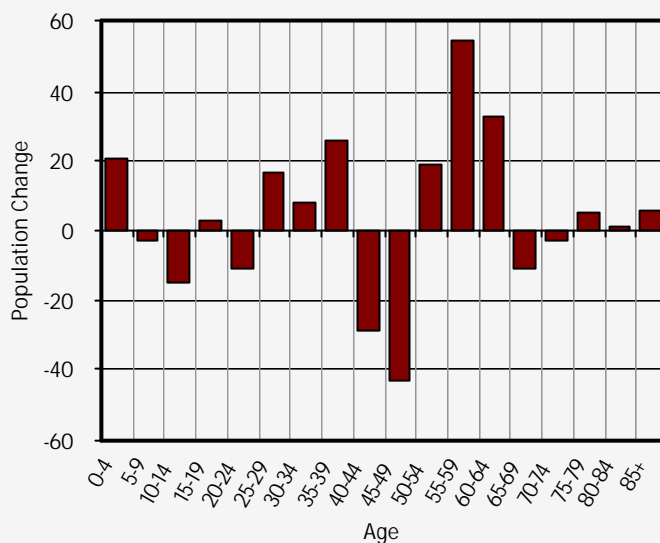
- The number of young people (0-14 years) increased by 0.8% from 375 people at the 30th June 1996 to 378 people at the 30th June 2001.
- The number of older people (65 years and over) decreased by 1.7% from 117 people at the 30th June 1996 to 115 people at the 30th June 2001.
- The number of 'working age' people (15-64 years) increased by 5.9% from 1,313 people at the 30th June 1996 to 1,390 people at the 30th June 2001.

- At the 30th June 2001, 20.1% of the Sheldon population were aged under 15 years, and 6.1% were aged 65 and over. This compares with 21.3% and 11.6% respectively for Queensland.
- At the 30th June 2001, 2.1% of the Sheldon population were aged 75 years and over, an increase from 1.5% in 1996.

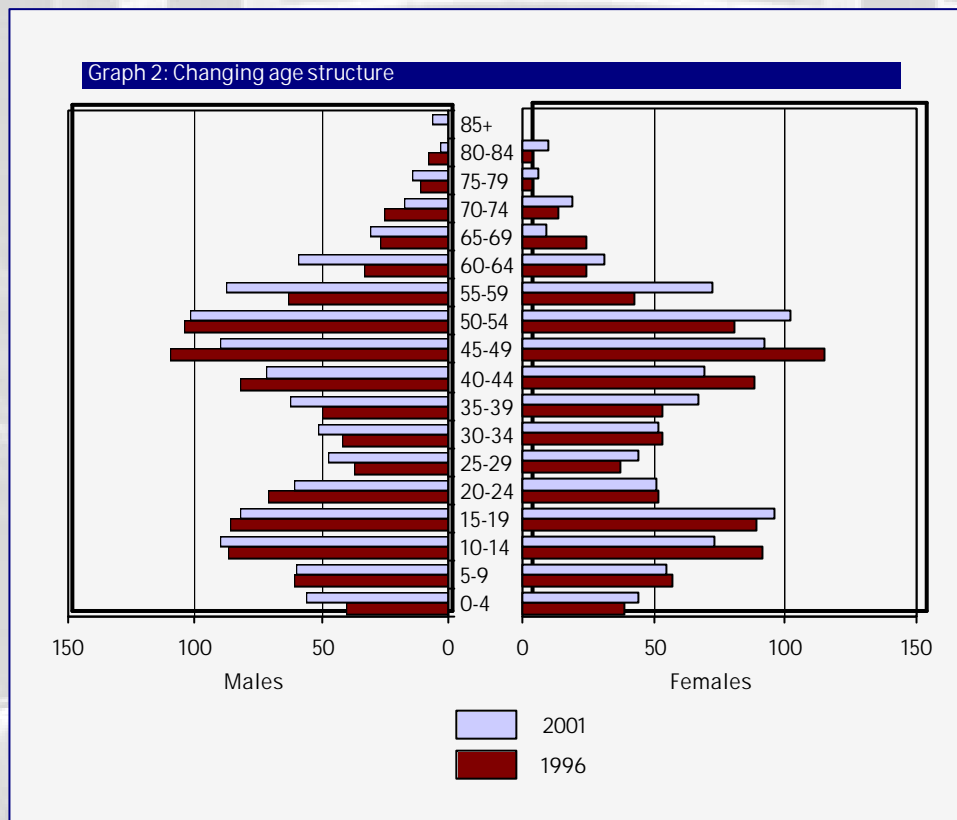

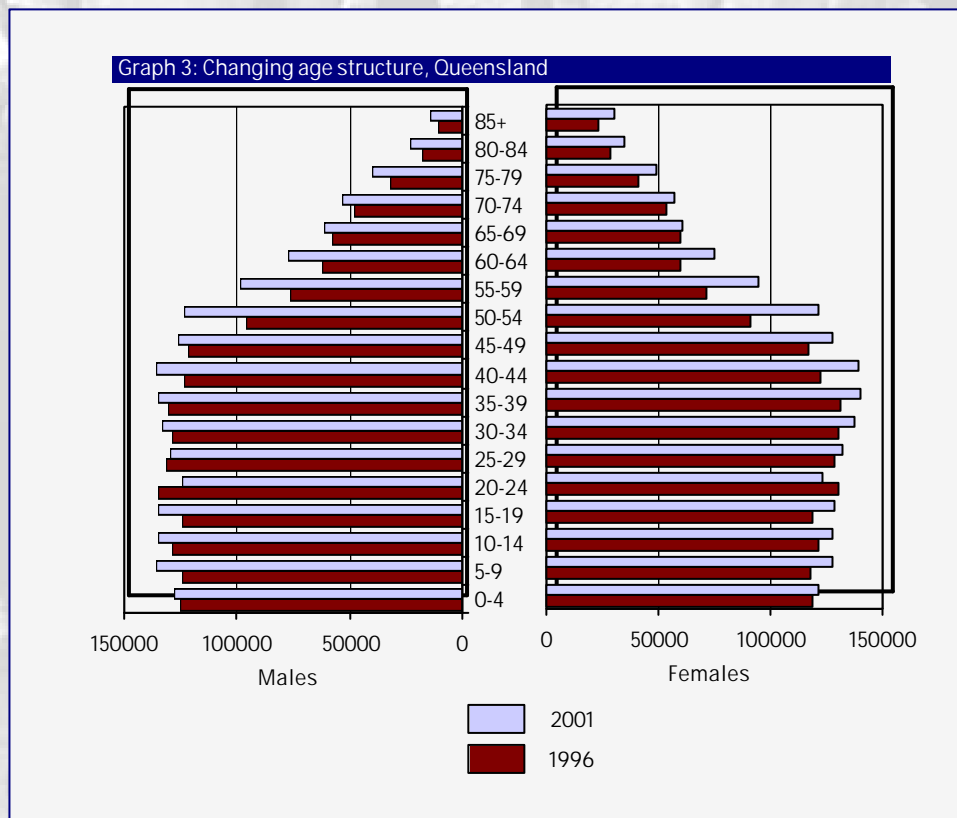
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Changing age structure

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Usual residents

- In Sheldon on Census night 2001, there were 19 overseas visitors (1.1% of the region's census count) and 37 domestic visitors (2.1% of the region's census count). This compares with 1.9% and 6.2% respectively for Queensland.

Year of arrival

- In Sheldon, of the 336 people who were born overseas, 86.9% arrived in Australia before 1991, and 8.9% arrived from 1996 onwards. This compares with 68.3% and 17.5% respectively for Queensland.

Language spoken at home

- 93.9% of Sheldon's population reported they spoke only English at home.
- However, 70 people (4.2% of the population) reported they spoke another language at home. This compares with 7.1% for Queensland.
- The top five languages spoken at home in Sheldon were German (17.6% of all people speaking another language), Netherlandic (12.2%), Tagalog/Filipino (12.2%), Chinese (8.1%), and Greek (8.1%).

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Birthplace

- The number of people in Sheldon who were born overseas decreased from 370 people in 1996 to 332 people in 2001. The percentage of the population born overseas decreased from 21.2% in 1996 to 18.6% in 2001.
- The highest ranking birthplace countries of people who were born overseas were the United Kingdom (birthplace of 158 people), New Zealand (birthplace of 33 people), South Africa (birthplace of 13 people), Malta (birthplace of 12 people), and Germany (birthplace of 9 people).
- More than 50 people failed to answer the Census question.

Population composition

- In Sheldon, 78.4% of the population was born in Australia. This figure compares with 77.7% for Queensland.
- Indigenous Australians accounted for 0.7% of Sheldon's population in 2001, compared with 3.1% for Queensland.

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Education

- In Sheldon, more than 510 people (or 28.8% of the population) were attending an educational institution in 2001.
- The number of people undertaking University or other Tertiary studies increased from 73 people in 1996 to 91 people in 2001.
- The number of people undertaking Technical or Further Education decreased from about 45 people in 1996 to 40 people in 2001.

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Marital status

- In Sheldon, about three fifths of the population aged 15 years and over (61.8% or 893 people), reported that they were married, compared with 51.1% for Queensland
- In Sheldon, there were 104 people who were separated or divorced and 43 widows/widowers.
- About one quarter of the population had never married.

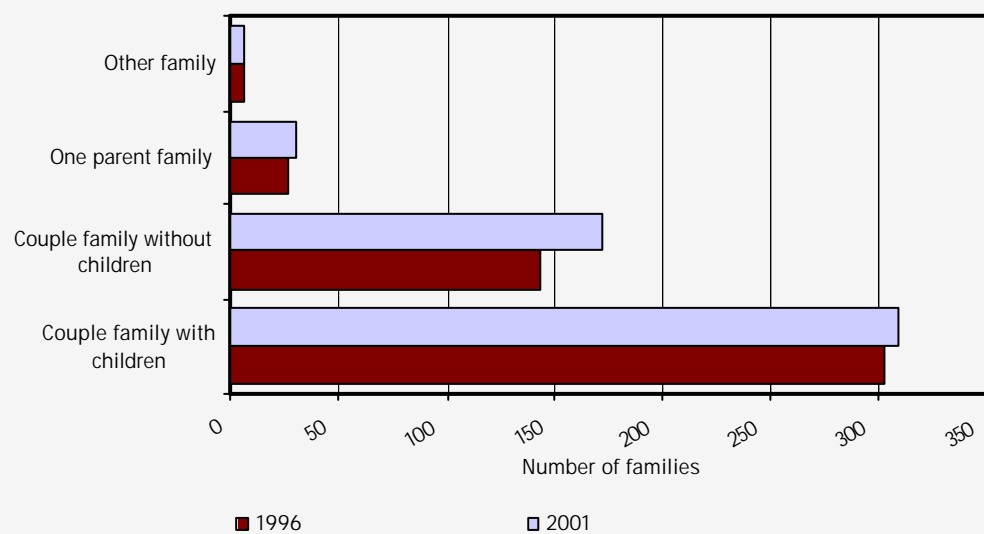
- Couple families with children decreased from 63.1% of all families in 1996 to 59.7% in 2001.

Graph 4: Family types



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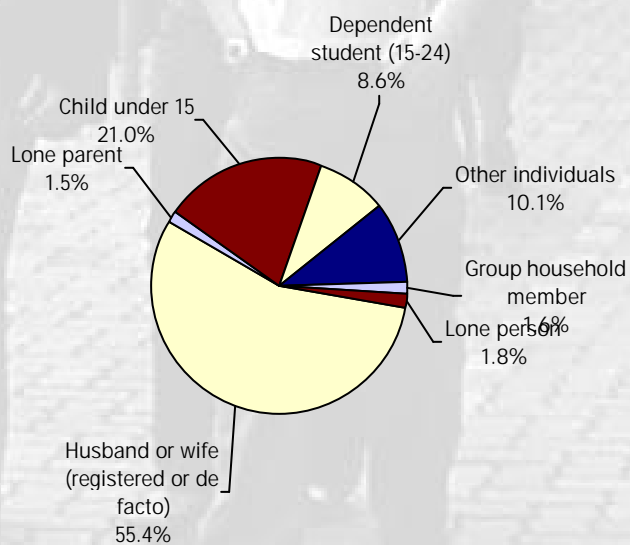
Relationships

- In Sheldon, there were 31 people living alone in 2001, representing 1.8% of the population.
- In addition, there were 25 lone parents in Sheldon, representing 1.5% of the population. This compares with 4.6% for Queensland.
- Husbands and wives accounted for 55.4% of the Sheldon population in 2001, an increase of 2.4 percentage points since 1996.

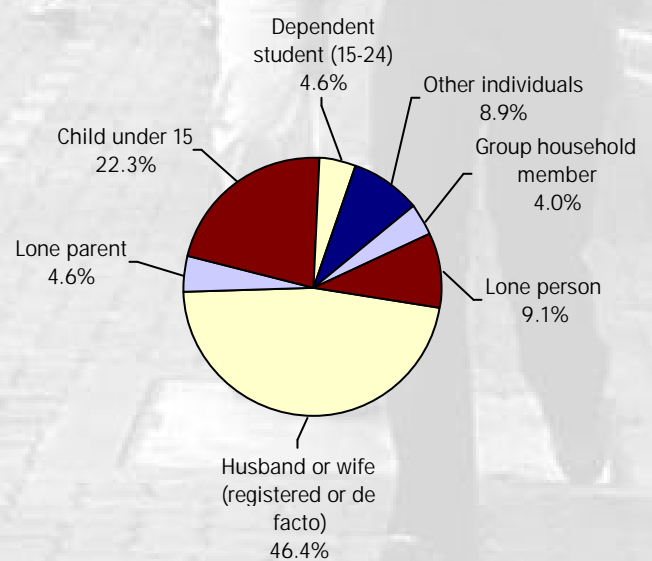

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Dwelling Stock

- In Sheldon, there were 577 private dwellings in 2001, representing an increase in dwelling stock of 4.3% since the 1996 Census. This figure compares with a population increase of 4.3%.
- In Sheldon, the number of occupied Townhouses remained steady at 0; the number of occupied Units decreased from 6 to 3 representing 0.5% of all dwelling stock.
- Between 1996 and 2001, there was an increase of 29 houses and the number of caravans increased to 6.

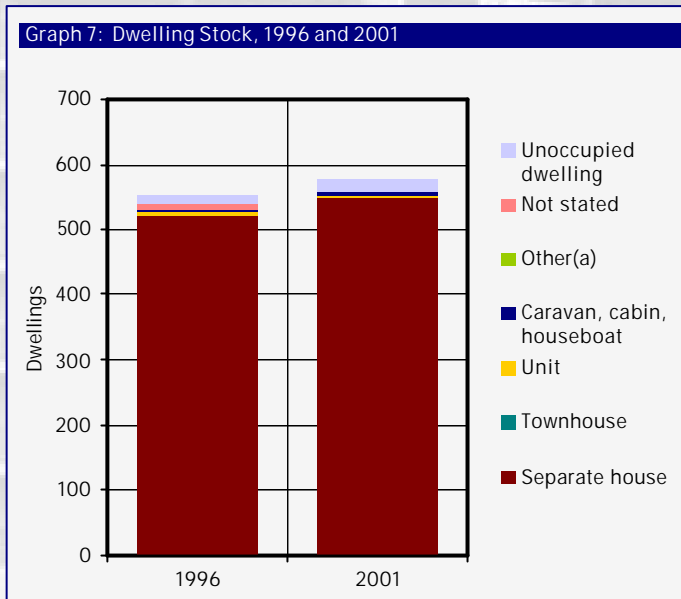

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Tenure

- In Sheldon, the proportion of occupied private dwellings owned or being purchased increased from 90.5% in 1996 to 92.3% in 2001. This compares with 62.4% for Queensland
- The proportion of occupied private dwellings being rented decreased from 5.0% in 1996 to 3.6% in 2001.

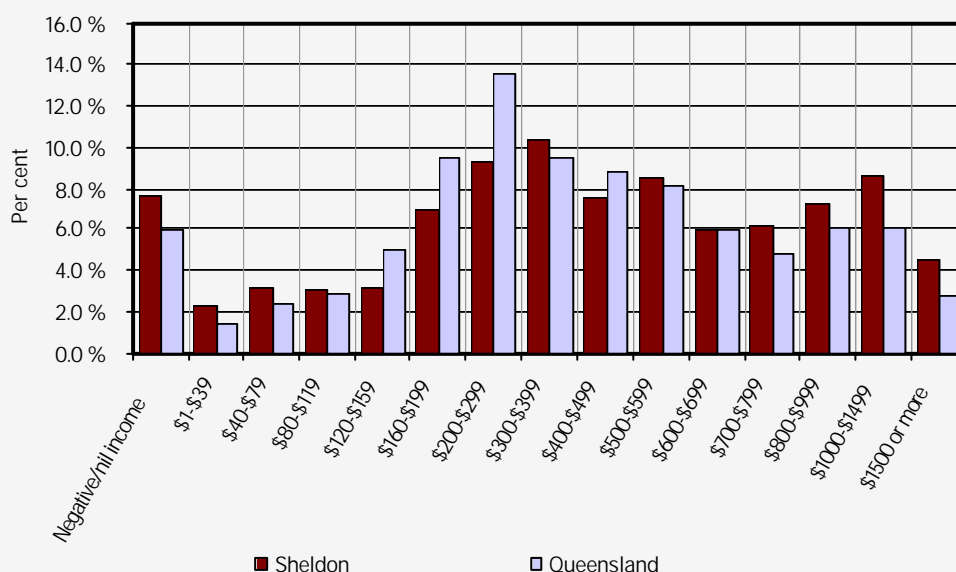
- In Sheldon, low income earners (earning less than \$200 a week), accounted for 26.3% of all people aged 15 years and over in 2001.
- High income earners (earning more than \$1,500 a week), accounted for 4.5% of all people aged 15 years and over in 2001.
- Sheldon had a higher proportion of people earning incomes of \$500 a week or more, and a smaller proportion of people earning less than \$500 a week, when compared to Queensland figures.

Mortgage

- In 2001, more than half of the housing mortgages in Sheldon had repayments exceeding \$1000 a month, while more than a quarter of the mortgages had monthly repayments of over \$1400. This compares with Queensland where more than half had monthly repayments of over \$800, and over a quarter had repayments that exceeded \$1000 a month.

- In 2001, dwellings being rented in Sheldon had a median weekly rent of between \$100 and \$150. This compares with Queensland's median rent of between \$150 and \$200 a week in 2001.
