## Terms & Conditions for camping at Lions Boulevard Park



## General Information

Booking a camp site is essential and the maximum booking period will be three (3) nights. Campers will be issued with a camping permit and you will need to carry the permit with you for inspection.

For a weekend visit, please make your booking online or call by 12:00pm Friday. Bookings outside regular business hours are to be made online. A maximum of eight (8) people are permitted at any one time.

A register of all people camping in the park is required and your name and contact details will be held by Council as a record of your stay and to provide statistics of the camp site usage.

Bookings fees & bonds will not be applied during the trial period but will be reviewed on conclusion of the camping trial in 12 months.

Park Features and Information	
Location:	Lions Boulevard Park is on the waterfront on the Boulevard Russell Island. The park is on the south eastern tip of the island and is approximately 1.01ha. The northern park of the park is used as an informal boat ramp. The park is 2500sqm and is a flat turfed area.
Where to camp:	Two (2) camping areas are designated on the northern end of the park. You will be allocated one of these.
Park features:	Lighting, water, table sand seat combinations, one (1) large shelter and two (2) small shelters, two (2) wood burning barbeques (firewood provided), two (2) electric barbeques, play equipment, wheelie bins, toilets, outdoor shower and hand washing basin.
Access:	The campground can be reached by water (kayak, tinny, sailing or motorboat, canoe) by bicycle, by a 2 and 4 wheel drive vehicles or motor bike.
Number of sites:	Two (2) sites with a maximum of four (4) people at each site.
Camp sites:	Suitable for Tent camping only, unpowered
Facilities:	One (1) public unisex composite toilet which is disabled compliant.
Essentials to bring:	Insect repellent (mosquitoes, sandflies and biting midges are present all year round) and toilet paper (limited paper is provided).
Mobile phone coverage:	Limited reception.
Small water craft:	May be stored near tents for security purposes.
Dogs:	Allowed off leash in the designated "Dog off Leash Area" and only during certain times. Please refer to the signage. In other areas of the park, dogs must remain on a lead.
Police matters:	<ul> <li>Contact Police on 000 for intervention and assistance for the following matters below:</li> <li>drunken disorderly behaviour</li> <li>violence towards self, other campers, members of the public, local residents</li> <li>vandalism or theft or public or private property</li> <li>hooning in vehicles</li> <li>emergencies and accidents</li> <li>bushfire</li> </ul>

## **Prohibited Activities**

Damaging or interfering with trees, shrubs, fauna, plants or plant material, soils, sand or rocks.

Damaging or disturbing the ground surface, no digging trenches around tents.

Tying tent ropes to trees, park structures or furniture.

Burying rubbish or litter. All food scraps should be well wrapped before it is disposed of in refuse containers provided by council.

Bringing vehicles into the camping grounds as this is a tent only site.

Consuming alcohol in a public place is strictly prohibited in Queensland.

For health and hygiene reasons do not use the hand basin to clean clothes, wash dishes, kitchen utensils or small children.

Behaving in a riotous, disorderly, indecent, offensive, threatening or insulting manner that will cause disturbance or be a nuisance or annoyance to other permit holders and nearby residents.

Using glass containers, all cans, including ring tops and cigarette butts must be disposed of in a proper manner.

Using or running a generator between the hours of 9:30pm and 7:00am.

Open fires or fire pit (fines apply)
