Discussion highlights

Liz Ward from Tourism Tribe provided a presentation on 'ideas to inspire your destination website design'. Liz suggested that that an effective destination website should be smartphone compatible, interactive with social media channels, easily searchable and influential to target markets. Many destination websites are now experience-based and incorporate video content, powerful images, maps and pages that are interrelated.

Wayne Clift from The Tourism Group provided a presentation on visitor information. The Group, also known as Visit Queensland, investigated the types of visitor information services in the Redlands as an action of the *Redland City Tourism Strategy and Action Plan 2015-2020*. Various locations throughout the City have been assessed as potential sites for a visitor information centre (VIC). A number of factors need to be taken

into account including the necessity of 'bricks and mortar' VIC or if alternative options might be more suitable for the area. At this stage Council is assessing all options.

Frank Pearce provided an update on behalf of Council's Commonwealth Games Committee. Pre-games opportunities exist for the Redlands as well as procurement opportunities for local businesses through the Embracing 2018 website – www.embracing2018.com. Assets of the Redlands include its track parks for mountain biking and the open water for swimming events. The City is within close proximity to Chandler and Belmont. Development of Redlands tourism packages targeting athletes and visitors should be encouraged. There is an opportunity to target Gold Coast residents that may want to holiday during the Games. Redlands signature events in the year leading up to the Commonwealth Games should look to leverage from the Games i.e. co-branding. A Reconciliation Action Plan to encourage indigenous in reconciliation projects has been prepared by the State Government. Council will encourage the Redlands community to be involved in pre, during and post Games initiatives. Stakeholders to target include local schools, community groups to apply for community grants, sporting clubs, tourism operators and local businesses. Applications can be made for the Commonwealth Games mascot to attend local events – email Borobi directly via Borobi@goldoc.com. The Redlands is a 'Weave 100' community for the 1 Million Stars Project. The Commonwealth Games are to be a standing agenda item for the Redlands Tourism Subcommittee.
