

Systematic Inspection Program – Unregistered Cats and Unregistered Dogs

Background

The Systematic Inspection Program has been developed in accordance with the provisions of sections 113, 114 and 115 of the *Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008*, and section 134 of the *Local Government Act (2009)*.

In order to determine the accuracy of records, identify new cat and dog registrations, follow up on overdue cat and dog registrations and provide education to pet owners on responsible pet ownership, a requirement exists for Animal Management to carry out a Systematic Inspection Program of all residential and business premises within the Redland City area.

Registration of cats and dogs is required annually, from the age of three (3) months.

Purpose

The purpose of the program is to identify new cat and dog registrations, follow up on overdue cat and dog registrations and provide education to pet owners on responsible pet ownership.

Scope

The approved Systematic Inspection Program of residential and business premises within Redland City will run between **Monday 9 January 2017** and **Friday 7 April 2017**.

Authorised officers will visit properties between the hours of 8am and 5pm Monday to Friday.

Dates of Operation

The Systematic Inspection Program will commence at 8:00am on Monday 9 January 2017 and will cease at 5:00pm on Friday 7 April 2017.

The Systematic Inspection Program includes all residential and business premises within the Redland City area.
