Coochie improves its resilience

In response to community concerns surrounding the recent fires on both Macleay and Russell islands, it was a privilege to officiate at an open day in January at the Laurie Burns Recreation Reserve on Coochiemudlo Island.

Representatives were on hand from Queensland Fire and Emergency Services, Council's Local Disaster Management Team, Queensland Ambulance Service, Coochie's first responders and the island's Auxiliary Fire Service.

It was an extremely informative event which presented a series of emergency scenarios, including a car-crash rescue and a kitchen fire. The day concluded with a community engagement session to discuss bushfires and disaster management plans.

Funding for coastal strategy

The development of Council's comprehensive Coastal Adaptation Strategy has been backed with \$195,650 in funding from the State Government's QCoast2100 Program.

Council worked closely with the Local Government Association of Queensland to present our case for the grant, which will support Council's strategy to identify and develop management plans for erosion-prone areas.

This will put the Redlands on the front foot in tackling coastal erosion, particularly in island communities, and recognises that we face significant issues as a relatively small council with about 220km of coast to manage.



When finalised, the overall strategy will provide a consistent and transparent approach to managing existing and emerging coastal hazards, as well as informing future planning.

Council is now about to begin community engagement as part of Phase 2, which looks at emerging risks and

will address long-term concerns for areas of our coastline as well as community expectations.

Subject to budget approval, Council will undertake a Soil Erosion Management Plan for Coochie in the 2017-18 financial year which will include formation of a reference group.

Island green-seal project on track

By the time you read this, the Coochie "green" road-sealing program will have started, weather permitting. All going well, all unsealed roads on Coochie should be completed by the end of June, leading to a welcome reduction in dust problems and minimising silt run-off into Moreton Bay.
