



Budget news from your Local Councillor

Dear resident

The Budget has been completed and once again the Redlands' long-term financial sustainability was forefront in my mind.

With an average rate rise of 3.96 per cent, Council is forecasting an operating deficit of about \$11 million.

Our \$82.05 million capital works program is ambitious and I will closely monitor its delivery. It does, however, provide for important improvements to community infrastructure in our division.

At present, I am continuing to lobby the State Government to change the new Queensland Rail zoning which negatively impacts Redlands commuters. I have asked for Ormiston and Cleveland to be included with Wellington Point in Zone 2 as more commuters are driving to the latter to board the train, as it saves money. This has created major parking and traffic issues for nearby residents and rail passengers at Wellington Point. See my website at www.wendyboglary.com for updates on this and the budget.

Snapshot of capital works proposed for Division 1:

- Three Paddocks Park, proposed playground and BMX track;
- Village Green carpark upgrade;
- Public amenities and shelter at EGW Woods Sportfield;
- Exercise equipment for Wellington Point Reserve;
- Wellington Point streetscape public art;
- Sylvania Place Park renewal;
- Wellington Street, Ormiston, footpath;
- Wellington Point Hall upgrade;
- Raby Bay Esplanade canoe-launching pontoon;
- Shade and seating at Goodall Street Park, Wellington Point;
- Road widening, frontage works on Arthur Street, Ormiston;
- Pitt and Nelson roads intersection upgrade;
- Wellington Point boat ramp resurfacing;
- Road resurfacing at Bayview, Christina, Rye, Station, Bainbridge, Gordon and Sturgeon streets, Waterford Crescent and Grenoble Place.

These improvements have all been suggestions from various locals. I would especially like to mention the valued input from the Redlands College "planners".


Having contributions from this age group on what they would like to see in our community is wonderful and their planning assignments are of such standards that I forward them to our design team.




GAME ON: The new lighting at the Allstars Netball courts makes the area look like a stadium. Allstars is more than just a club ... it's a netball community.
