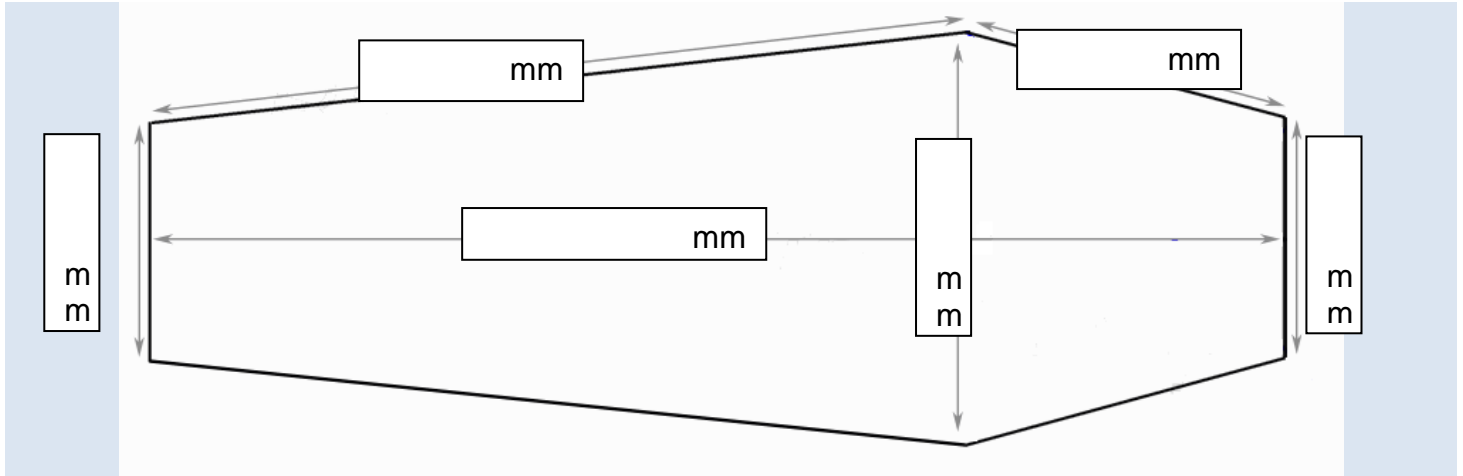
## General Conditions for Coffin Interments

To ensure the maximum use of a coffin allotment we recommend only FLAT lid traditional shaped coffins are used for every interment. If other styles of coffin are used there can be no guarantee of successful multiple interments or monumental work requiring footings/foundations.

Memorial foundations either contemporary or old/existing are to be expected to be present with every interment in a "monumental" designated area. Knowing the width of the head and foot of coffins is as important as the length and width.

**The measurements given below are EXACT outer dimensions of the coffin that will arrive for interment. This INCLUDES any rigid / collapsible handles at their widest, 'OPEN' point.**

## In-Ground Coffin Interment Allotments

Coffin materials and construction for earth or in-ground interment is an important consideration when interring at one of Redland City Council Cemeteries. We understand the need for a suitable coffin for the interment of family members. Every interment at Redland is expected not to be hindered from returning to the soil within a reasonable period of time. To ensure this we encourage and recommend the following:

- Coffins and containers that meet the health regulation requirements and ARE NOT ferrous metal, alloy or bronze, plastic coated etc.,
- Coffins and containers made of sustainable all natural materials that include:
  - ✓ Untreated timber
  - ✓ Paper and cardboard that only use biodegradable glues, resins, surfactants, etc.
- Embalming and/or chemical preservation that will slow any natural process (other than that periodically required under the relevant regulations of Queensland) are not to be used with in-ground interments.
- Traditional shaped, FLAT LID coffins – with a clearly tapered head and foot are preferred.
- Cremation interments in coffin burial allotments are permitted ONLY once a full coffin interment has taken place in that allotment.
  - ✓ We recommend Cremation ashes are placed directly into the soil or in a biodegradable container. We will place the Cremation ashes at the head of the allotment.

## Above-Ground Coffin Interment Allotments

Materials and construction for above-ground interment (ie: in columbarium niche walls, mausoleum chambers without direct contact with, and drainage to soil) is a different consideration to in-ground interments. Coffins for above ground interments must comply with the relevant regulations, Local Laws, etc., in Queensland. Currently RCC requires:

- Coffins and containers must meet the regulation requirements and we will not permit them to be made of easily damaged materials like soft or composite wood, cardboard etc.
- Coffins and containers made of all natural materials must also include a hermetically sealed inner liner (usually zinc or heavy PVC eg: Bioseal 5) where the body has been fully arterially embalmed and prepared at a registered mortuary before sealing.
- Cremation urns must be made of sturdy crack resistant PVC, sturdy hardwood or non-corrosive metals/bronze where cremations are placed within any chamber / mausoleum,
  - ✓ A selection of urns and containers can be ordered through Cemetery & Interment Services.
