



# Are you a dog person?

Redland residents love their dogs. As a dog owner in the Redlands you do have responsibilities to help make sure dogs, wildlife and residents can live happily side by side.

## Register your dog

- ✓ All dogs over three months old must be registered with Council, then have registration renewed every 12 months
- ✓ Current registration tags should be attached to your dog's collar

## Exercise your dog

- ✓ walk your dog on a lead
- ✓ keep your dog under effective control
- ✓ Remember to clean up after your dog and pick up droppings

## Microchipping

Microchipping your dog provides lifelong identification of your pet.

All dogs (and cats) must be microchipped if:

- they were born after 1 July 2009 or
- they are sold or given away

## Contain and restrain your dog

Wandering dogs can cause traffic accidents, attack people and animals, and are a general nuisance.

### Make sure:

- ✓ your dog is contained securely in your yard and is kept in a way so it does not disturb your neighbours
- ✓ our wildlife is protected from a dog attack
- ✓ your dog is restrained when in the car
- ✓ a maximum of two dogs are kept on your property (permits are required for more than two dogs – conditions apply)

## Impounded dogs

If your dog is found wandering and is impounded at Council's Animal Shelter, they can be reclaimed by paying the applicable release fee.
