Activity: Vessel Exclusion Zone

Mariners are advised that the Redland City Council - Local Disater Management Group has established a 100 metre exclusion zone for all waters surrounding North Stradbroke Island. The 100 metre boundary is measured from Lowest Astronomical Tide (LAT). The restrictions are in place for the period Thursday 02 April 2020 until Friday, 29 May 2020, unless otherwise advised.

This notice is for pleasure craft only, and not for commercial/emergency services, marine rescue and essential services for the island.

During times of inclement weather or emergency, recreational vessels are still permitted to seek safe anchorage in areas which may fall within the 100 metre exclusion zone. Recreational vessels transiting through a waterway which may be within the 100 metre exclusion zone are also permitted to do so.

Only permanent residents and those engaged in essential travel are permitted ashore. For further details see the attached notification from Redland City Council


North Stradbroke Island (Minjerribah) Travel Ban
