Boundary changes even up the numbers

With the next local government election less than four months away, the Queensland Electoral Commission needed to ensure that all the Council divisions are balanced in terms of enrolled voter numbers.

Division 5, which includes a large portion of Redland Bay plus the Southern Moreton Bay Islands, is the largest in terms of elected voters and

also in workload due to its diversity and needs.

A Council report found the average number of voters in each division last year was 9769, with Division 5 having 10,726 voters.

The Queensland Electoral Commission has determined that the electoral size of Division 5 needs to be reduced to ensure a fair distribution of voters across the City's 10 divisions.

It has determined that all properties west of Moogurrapum Creek will now fall into Division 6, which includes Mount Cotton.

This means that Redland Bay State School, of which I am a P&C member, will become part of Division 6 as of the next election.

However that will not be a problem as Councillors must represent the whole of the City.

You may notice a number of roads being resealed in Redland Bay as Council continues to rollout road maintenance programs that will ensure our streets have a long operational life before replacement.
