
Paul's volunteering started well before he arrived in the Redlands. In Sydney he was involved with his local

Toondah Harbour update

The Walker Group has been busy working with specialists in urban planning, design and the environment to prepare a concept masterplan for Toondah Harbour's revitalisation.

Since the State Government formally endorsed the \$1.3 billion Priority Development Area project in June, Walker Group has sponsored the Relish Festival at Raby Bay in October and the Island Vibe Festival at Point Lookout in October/November and launched a website www.toondah-harbour.com.au.

By the end of the year it is expected that Walker Group will refer the project to the Federal Minister for the Environment under the *Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act*

and apply to the Coordinator General for a coordinated project declaration. During the environmental impact assessment process, there will be opportunities for residents to have their say on the project plans.

REDLANDS ... BE BUSHFIRE & STORM SAFE



We are approaching bushfire and storm season, so it is important to plan for both.

- Prepare a family emergency plan
- Prepare your home to minimise damage

Redland City Council's disaster management plan provides information on how to prepare for and recover from a disaster.

Ten things you must include

Your emergency kit should contain:

- a portable radio with spare batteries
- a torch with spare batteries
- a first-aid kit
- candles and waterproof matches
- a waterproof bag for valuables
- important documents including emergency contact numbers



If evacuation is likely or required:

- a good supply of any prescribed medications
- any special requirements for babies, the disabled, infirm or elderly
- strong shoes and protective clothing
- food and drinking water

Assembling an evacuation kit

I want you to consider putting together an emergency evacuation kit containing the items that you will need should you be forced to relocate. Here is a list of essential items that you can personalise to suit your own requirements.

Medical: Prescriptions, medicines, Medicare number, contact details of your local doctor, puffers, spare glasses, a clear account of any special medical needs that you may have.

Documents: Passport, driving licence (copy), Medicare card (copy), bank account details, credit card numbers, birth certificate, copy of your will, list of critical telephone numbers.

Insurance: Policy documents including vehicle and or boat policies.

Clothing: Sufficient for five to 10 days (include comfortable shoes). Remember personal items such as a toothbrush, comb and toiletries.

Irreplaceable items: Photographs (scan irreplaceable memories onto a memory stick), jewellery (heirlooms such as grandma's wedding ring).

Things to consider: A few good books, transistor radio and batteries, diaries. There are other things that you might consider important enough to include in your kit, but the main thing is to be prepared. We all hope that we will never need to grab the kit and run, but if the day ever does arrive, you will so relieved that you have everything ready to go.

Here's a tip! Keep your kit somewhere accessible but secure - you do not want it falling into the wrong hands.
