#### Dear residents of Division 1,

Unbelievably we are seeing the end of 2010 drawing close. What a fantastic and successful year we have had!!! I hope everyone takes time to reflect and though we all have difficult times we must cherish those precious family, friends' gatherings and achievements at our work. This is what is rewarding and makes our lives wonderful.

It has been a busy year in Council and I believe our achievements will all have a positive impact on our city and our treasured Redlands lifestyle.

For the first part of the year, most of our meetings dealt with investigating different aspects of the budget. We have introduced **rates reform** which has made the system fairer across the city and delivered a new **financial strategy** to ensure Redland City Council will be delivering the most efficient and effective level of service possible. We are leaving no stone unturned as we restructure and bring about a cultural and monetary shift throughout the organisation.

This second half of the year waste management was the major hot topic. Waste is a global issue and the Redlands is no different. We have investigated many options to find the most cost effective, waste reduction program available. It has been known for a decade that Birkdale Landfill had a limited life but unfortunately there was very limited progression on an alternative, therefore it became an urgent priority. We were not happy with the inherited situation or the solutions given to us. I was not happy that my residents were going to have to travel 25km to go to the transfer station so we didn't accept this situation and we asked for officers to think outside the box. Redland City Council through successful negotiations with Brisbane City Council have now signed a contract which means Redland City Council no longer needs to build a waste management facility and means Council will save around \$50m over the next 10 years in waste costs. This will allow time for a regional solution to be developed involving a number of south-east Queensland councils. As part of our waste strategy we will investigate building a new transfer station at Birkdale which will generate much less dust, smell and noise than the present landfill which is a win for neighbouring residents. It is such a positive outcome as we are now intending to provide facilities at both ends of the city, both at Redland Bay and Birkdale, plus it is a great outcome for the environment regionally.

Residents have asked about a **green waste recycling bin**. Brisbane City Council has recently introduced these bins on a trial basis and Redland City Council officers are monitoring their results.

Kerbside collection has also been requested by residents. Council investigated this idea in 2008 and was advised by other councils who offered the service not to proceed due to negative impacts and cost. Council is still investigating the options to implement some variance to this system.

There are some trying to hype up the **illegal dumping issue**. Out of 150,000 transactions at our transfer stations, Council only had 150 requests of illegal dumping. There has never been records kept on this concern until last year so at present there is no way anyone can accurately say if fees have caused an increase or not. Council can now monitor for future years. Unfortunately many items that are 'dumped' are free, so it is simply being irresponsible. I am currently in discussions with '**Keep Australia Beautiful**' regarding various options for decreasing the amount of local litter and rubbish that continues to find its way into our waterways. Please remember every little piece of litter hurts our wildlife and will in turn eventually hurt us. **Cleveland Centre Master Plan** has been adopted. This concludes a process that commenced in 2007. We initiated further community consultation and lowered the height of buildings from twelve stories to eight from the initial plan. We have widened the streets to allow for more street-scaping including plantings. More open space has been included and we have embraced the bay. When looking at the plans, remember this is only an artist's conceptual impression of what could possibly be built.

It is now up to the developers to work with the community and Council to deliver a city heart with character and plenty of social interaction while allowing our retail centre to thrive and increase our local economy. I walked the pavement of Cleveland heart and Shore Streets last week talking with business owners. We have some great outlets with very capable owners.

I urge all Queenslanders to read about South Caloundra. Recently the state government decided to take direct control of planning for this development from the Sunshine Regional Council and give to the Urban Land Development Authority, an unelected unaccountable bureaucracy. Yes that's right, a city of 50,000 will spring up without the local elected council or the community having any say! If it happens here, where will be next?
