Meanwhile, Council is still awaiting State Government permits for the new Ormiston canoe facility but it should be constructed by the middle of next year.



Village Green feedback to inform makeover

The hottest topic of feedback at Wellington Point's streetscape consultation day in June was what should be done with the under-used Village Green.

Most of the input showed a desire to revitalise the space and provide opportunities for new activities, events, play and fun.

Our collaboration with the community and The Place Design

Group is expected to result in the Village Green becoming the new, accessible heart of Wellington Point Village. There'll be places to sit and relax under timber coastal-style shelters, a children's play area and a grassed amphitheatre facing a covered stage. This semi-circular grassed area could be used for concerts, exercise classes or movie nights as well as reading, relaxing and picnics.

The design concept includes a new toilet block, new plantings and a multi-functional plaza area which could be used for markets and other events

I am grateful for the valuable insight gained as a result of the streetscape consultation day, and support for a future overhaul of the Village Green. People sent a clear message that improving the Village Green is a priority which will solve many of the issues raised, as well as providing a space for the kinds of activities our residents say they want.

Council posted signage on the Village Green in October showing the proposed design concept, and provided information on Council's 'Your Say' page – Wellington Point Streetscape Day so people could examine the plan and provide further feedback if desired. The plan will now go to into the detailed design phase, which is expected to be finalised early next year, with staged construction expected from mid-2018.

Meanwhile, Creative Arts Redlands has appointed CreativeMove as the public art curator to manage the development of public art for and around the Wellington Point Village roundabout.

An artwork commission brief has been prepared and will soon go out to open tender for submissions by professional artists. Themes for the artwork from the community consultation day include nature, bay and sea, local landmarks including the jetty, point and King Island, as well as Quandamooka heritage.



Wellington Point Streetscape Consultation

This is a result of feedback from 377 locals on what the Village needs. We listened to feedback from the community at our Streetscape Consultation Day in June and found that your highest priority was improvements to the Village Green.
