Park development good news for local families

The transformation of Thornlands Community Park is of keen interest to many Division 4 families as it offers a great open space for activities and get-togethers.

Development of the park is continuing, with a farmhouse makeover now underway. Preliminary underground works have begun and are scheduled to be completed in time for the December school holidays.

Additional work on the play elements is due to start in late January and are scheduled for completion in late May, weather and site conditions permitting.

This wonderful park will offer a variety of play spaces catering to all ages and abilities, including a climbing structure, spinner and double

cableway and a farmer's market café in the toddler play space.

Thornlands Community Park focuses on all-ability play spaces with the installation of an inclusive swing, inclusive orbit, accessible sand scoops and a sensory play centre which further supports the existing all-abilities public amenities.

Nature and water play will also be incorporated with the installation of water-pump play elements, including, tipping troughs and mini sluice gates.

This community park will provide a wide range of activities combined with existing picnic areas, kick-about spaces, off-street parking and public amenities, enhancing the liveability of the area around it.

Cycleway on a roll

By the time you read this work should be completed on the section of the Moreton Bay Cycleway from Cameron Court up to School Road, Victoria Point.

The section from School Road to Orana Street, which will utilise the existing fire trail and include an upgrade to the existing boardwalk, will form stage two.

Lakefield Drive will have a portion of off-road cycleway with the rest an on-road cycleway.

This is expected to be completed about next August, providing an uninterrupted cycleway to the Victoria Point and Cleveland shopping precincts, and eventually to Redland Bay.
