UPGRADE: Recent work done in Doull Place, Bush Cherry Place and Freshwater Park were among many completed projects across our division.

Dear resident,

Some important information for residents is the Queensland Electoral Commission's boundary change which takes effect at the council election on 28 March next year. As Division 3 exceeded the legislated enrolment quota, the north-western boundary has been contracted east to follow Bloomfield Street and Panorama Drive and has expanded slightly in the south to gain part of Victoria Point that is bounded by Cleveland - Redland Bay Road, Bunker Road and Brookvale Drive.

It has been a busy term for this division, with a range of work important to residents progressing.

Our parks have come in for plenty of attention, with work continuing in our increasingly popular Thornlands Community Park where you will soon see some exciting new additions to the existing picnic areas, kick-about spaces, off-street parking and public amenities. A farmhouse-themed makeover is underway, with preliminary works scheduled to be completed in time for the December school holidays. Work on the play elements is due to start in late January and are scheduled for completion in late May, weather and site conditions permitting.

This wonderful park will offer a variety of play spaces catering to all ages and abilities, including a climbing structure, spinner and double cableway, and a farmer's market café in the toddler play space.

Thornlands Community Park has a focus on all-ability play spaces with the installation of an inclusive swing, inclusive orbit, accessible sand scoops and a sensory play centre which further supports the existing all-abilities public amenities.

Nature and water play will also be incorporated with the installation of water-play elements. Other parks to get upgrades include: William Stewart Park - playground upgrades, street art, new lights and footpaths.

Robert Mackie Park - playground upgrades to include adventure play and creek-line restorations.

Crystal Waters Park - continued environmental management programs and a new boardwalk for bird viewing and replanting.

Riley Peter Place Park - revegetation and creek-line repairs, new footpaths and walking trail.

Arlington Street Park - upgrade of play equipment and associated works and footpath repairs.

Lorikeet Drive Park - renewal of basketball facilities.

Henry Ziegenfusz Park – renewal of equipment and shelters.

Meanwhile, Freshwater Park is due to get new play equipment and a dog off-leash area.

There also has been attention to combating graffiti in our parks, such as Crystal Waters Park, through the use of colourful public art to deter vandals.

Council has also worked to restore native habitat through the purchase of land adjacent to Clifford Perske Drive rehabilitation into a muchneeded wildlife corridor which connects with Holden Street Wetlands and Pinklands Bushland Refuge. Various areas around the division were replanted with koala food trees.

Many residents would also have noticed resealing in their streets, including Albicore Drive, Tuna
