Last December, Victoria Point State School's School Road carpark was resurfaced and relined by Council contractors ready for the new school year. The entire length of School Road also has been fully resurfaced.

It is important to note that the exit from the Colburn Avenue carpark at the school is now "Left Turn Only", as signed, at drop-off and pick-up times. This will improve safety and assist in reducing queuing times.

Work ramped up

I am pleased to report that Council contractors have completed the new revetment wall project on Masters Avenue and are currently working to replace the existing Victoria Point barge ramp.

Six car/boat trailer parking bays have been fenced off from the seawall project to house equipment and a site shed.

At the time of writing, work was expected to be finished about now, weather permitting.

The barge ramp is a \$765,800 project, with the new revetment wall costing about \$357,000.
