An exciting year for Judy Holt sport precinct

The Judy Holt Sports Fields at Birkdale have developed into one of Redlands Coast's premier sports and fitness precincts.

Council's additions to the area and support for those who use it has made this a great example of a community facility for all age groups.

It stands as testament to the late Judy Holt, who worked tirelessly to encourage children to take part in sport and promote a community for families to support each other.

Our community was saddened by her recent passing, as well as that of John Smallwood, who has also left a wonderful legacy at Judy Holt Sports Fields.

Judy was a patron and life member of Muddies Cricket Club, helping it since its establishment in the 1990s as an offshoot of the rugby union club, while John, also a life member, worked tirelessly to promote cricket in the Redlands.

Through their efforts, and those original members of Muddies Rugby Union Club, Muddies Cricket Club has evolved into a first-class cricket facility with two turf wickets and a synthetic wicket.

Muddies Rugby Union Club also celebrates 40 years in the Redlands this year, a great achievement that would never have been possible without the support of Judy, its founding patron.

The club now has more than 350 juniors playing, plus two senior teams and the Golden Oldies, boasting players from just three years to 35plus. You can find out more about the club's fundraising activities and celebrations planned for the year by going to **www.facebook.com/ redlandsrugbyunion**.

It is great to see Muddies' new playground, complete with its colourful shade structure, now being enjoyed. It was funded through my Community Infrastructure Program and installed in time for the new rugby season. Meanwhile, I was also pleased to be able to provide a Councillor Small Grant to the cricket club to help seal the concrete shelter structures.

They are among a range of clubs finding success in the precinct.

Since moving there two years ago, Starfish Tri-Athletic Club has grown into one of Queensland's premier triathlon and athletics clubs.

Starfish Tri-Athletic won Triathlon Queensland's Small Club Championship and the Overall Aggregate Trophy last year, with head coach Ben Luscombe awarded Triathlon Queensland's Junior Coach of the Year.

In the past 12 months, this proudly inclusive community club has had nine athletes selected to compete at national level and 29 selected to compete at state level.

The club is a fine example of the importance of having access to quality facilities, such as the Judy Holt Sporting Fields, which has become vital to our community's wellbeing and sporting growth.

It offers training in a safe and natural environment, well-kept grassed ovals and surrounding bushland described as "priceless" by members of Starfish.

Redlands Dog Obedience Club also has spent much of its 40-year history at the Judy Holt precinct, using it from Monday to Fridays to help residents train dogs as well as prepare them for competitive dog sports. The club also hosts regular competitions in association with Dogs Queensland and the Australian Flyball Association, bringing in competitors from across South East Queensland and further afield.
