Cat owners must take responsibility

While cats can be much-loved family members, owners have certain requirements and responsibilities to ensure their pets do not become a nuisance to others or kill native wildlife.

Redland City Council requires cat owners to register their pet by the time it is 12 weeks old or within 14 days of gaining ownership and that registration must be renewed every 12 months. While de-sexing is not mandatory, it is encouraged by way of discounted registration fees.

It is, however, mandatory to microchip all cats unless they were born or came into your ownership before 1 July 2009.

Cat owners also have a responsibility to adequately contain their cat to

their property at all times under Council's local laws, as wandering cats poses a risk to native wildlife. Putting your cat out day or night to let it roam the neighbourhood or nearby bush contravenes local laws. Besides, wandering cats are also more susceptible to injury, disease and ticks and can land you with hefty veterinary bills as well as a \$261 fine.

If you have a problem with a wandering cat, contact Redland City Council on 3829 8999 and lodge a complaint, which will be investigated by the Animal Management Team. Council also has a cat trap service which may be considered for use to assist and control with cat wandering issues.

More to come for family park

Planning is almost complete for the next phases of Thornlands Community Park's transformation into welcoming family recreation area.

With the finishing touches to the initial stage now done, Council will be adding an all-abilities play area and exercise and youth recreation facilities subject to budget availability. Detailed designs for these latter stages are almost complete.

With the barbecues, a shelter with picnic seating and other amenities in place, as well as shade trees and other landscaping, the park is really starting to take shape.

I thank all those in our community who have had input into what will be a great space for our growing area.

It is among a number of parks across Division 3 which has or may benefit from Council investing in such family friendly park enhancements.

Keeping in shape in our parks

I recommend that residents consider taking the opportunity to join one of the activities in Council's Redlands Coast Healthy & Active Program.

Our popular group exercise program offers a diverse range of low-cost activities across Redlands Coast, at just \$5 per person, per session. This year, the program has introduced some new activities, including ninja warrior, cardio tennis and Billy's Buddies, a children's rugby league

based program founded by former Queensland Origin great Billy Slater. Also returning are the very popular Zumba classes, as well programs which cater for all levels of fitness.

The program is having a positive impact on the community, with about 1500 people taking part in more than 20 different activities.
