



### Mobile phone boost a priority

Council has continued lobbying the Federal Government for a slice of its \$220 million black-spot funding program to improve local mobile phone services.

There are a number of locations in the city where mobile coverage is less than ideal and we have been asking the Federal Government to prioritise these areas.

I am particularly concerned about coverage on North Stradbroke and Russell islands, with the current lack of reliable mobile coverage creating community and safety concerns. At a meeting with the office of Regional Communications Minister Bridgette McKenzie in Canberra recently I requested both islands be included in the next round of blackspot funding.

I pointed out that the Russell Island fire review clearly identified improved mobile services as critical to the island and stressed that Council is committed to working with the Federal Government and telecommunication companies to deliver these upgrades.

The isolation of our island communities is always a concern, but the potential risks become all too apparent during disasters such as the fires that have decimated both Straddie and Russell Island in recent years.

Last year I wrote to state and federal departments, along with telecommunication companies, requesting a coordinated approach to overcome the lack of communication services on these islands, as well as other community issues.

A delegation from Gifu Medical Science University in Japan will soon visit the Redlands to do a site inspection of our medical and nursing care facilities with a view to sending study tours here.

### Get ready for Dîner en Rouge

Tickets for Diner en Rouge, the Redlands' most mysterious and magnanimous fundraiser, are now available.

The annual formal event on Saturday 12 May 2018, to be held at a secret location, is at the heart of a growing movement of support for those affected by domestic and family violence.

Proceeds from previous gala banquets - which I am thrilled to report now total more than \$220,000, boosted by substantial donations from local community organisations and benefactors - are in a fund which will go towards providing extra crisis accommodation in the area.

While Dîner en Rouge is a lot of fun, it also underscores the need for a community effort to tackle the insidiousness of domestic and family violence.

I am hopeful the funds raised by this great annual event will lead to a significant boost in crisis accommodation in the Redlands' region, which is currently serviced by just seven crisis accommodation units. They cater for a population of more than 150,000 and are in high demand, with at least another four needed as soon as possible.

I believe these can be delivered swiftly should the State Government come on board and Council will continue to work with local domestic violence services to make that happen.

The location of Dîner en Rouge, which has a red and white theme, is kept secret until the night to recognise that domestic and family violence often occurs in secret. Tickets are always in demand, so it pays to get in early.
