Budget boosts community assets

Redland City's 2017-18 budget invests heavily in community infrastructure.

We are spending \$82 million across the city to cater for priorities identified by residents and the business community.

Nearly half of that is committed to improving the road network, renewing marine transport infrastructure and upgrading footpaths, bikeways, carparks and bus shelters.

More than \$23.6 million has been earmarked for road projects alone, while transport infrastructure such as footpaths, bikeways and bus shelters will account for another \$6.5 million.

Money has been set aside to upgrade Victoria Point's Yeo Park, along with Cascades Gardens and Poinciana Avenue parks. It also includes funding for the Moreton Bay Cycleway to Point O'Halloran, the seawall at Masters Avenue and upgrades for Victoria Point Community Hall.

Marine infrastructure and foreshores will benefit from a \$14.5 million allocation, with \$14.39 million set aside for open space and conservation projects.

Guides celebrate 50 years

Councillor Paul Golle and I were recently pleased to present a cheque from Council's Small Grants Program to Fran Burns ("Kirra") of Victoria Point Girl Guides (pictured) to fund the purchase of special badges to celebrate their 50th anniversary.

Established in 1967, a special day of celebration was held in July at the Victoria Point hut.

All the Guides' activities - from weekly meetings to camps, expeditions and hikes - are driven by the Guides themselves, with input and assistance from their leaders, and are planned to match the Guides' abilities. As part of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS), each Guide is a privileged member of a sisterhood of 10 million Guides worldwide, the world's largest voluntary organisation for girls and young women.

Easier access to council services

Residents now have improved access to Council services thanks to the opening of a customer service centre at Victoria Point.

The new centre at Victoria Point library, next to the shopping precinct, recognises the challenges residents face in travelling to Cleveland to visit Council's main customer service centre branch. The new branch offers all services, with the exception of building and development, which are only available at the main Cleveland branch because of the need to access specialist planning officers located at the Cleveland Administration building. It is open from 9am to 5pm, Monday to Friday (excluding public holidays).
