## Community garden a cut above

The Oaklands Street community garden at Alexandra Hills has received funding for a new zero-turn mower to improve mowing times for their community volunteers.

Both Cr Tracey Huges of neighbouring Division 8 and myself were more than happy to fund this worthy project.

The gardens provide much-needed education for our school children and other groups in our community.

## Park upgrades forge ahead

The major redevelopments of the Burwood Road, O’Gorman Street and Workington Street parks in Alexandra Hills, along with Chantelle Court in Capalaba, will start in the first quarter of the financial year with completion later in the year.

Dave Parr Park at Alexandra Hills will have some minor works done in the same period.



## IndigiScapes upgrade

IndigiScapes’ nursery is being relocated and the visitor centre office expanded in a \$1.3 million exercise.

Work on the \$3.2 million IndigiScapes redevelopment will continue over the next two years.



## MyHorizon’s new complex

Disabilities provider MyHorizon has started operations in its new digs, pictured, in Runnymede Road, next to Capalaba’s IndigiScapes centre.

MyHorizon was formed in the Redlands about 36 years ago and today employs 30 people with disabilities.

Its vision is to bring the Redlands community together and uplift lives by creating connected communities. Well done Joe Gambin, CEO of this amazing organisation.



## New trailhead for track park

Work on a new trailhead at the Kinross Road side of the popular Redland Track Park at Thornlands is scheduled for this financial year.

The new \$45,000 facility, similar to the one at Clarke Street pictured, will be accessible from the adjacent emerging residential estate via a path to the trailhead shelter and existing trail systems. Council's design team is currently working on the plans.



## Road resurfacing

Residents will see a lot of activity upgrading roads across the division this financial year.

Roads to be completely or partially resurfaced include:

**Alexandra Hills** – Crotona Road East, Brompton Street, Forestlea Court, Glover Drive, Kenton Street, Kindred Street, Lanreath Court, Legend Court, Liddel Court, Lynton Court, Pengana Court, Pensilva Court, Tintagel Court, Dinton Court, Fawley Court, Ferndown Street, Frampton Street and Weymouth Street.

**Capalaba** – Estaway Court, Finucane Road, Merrick Street, Nereid Street, Sagamore Street, Sutphin Street, Tremont Street and Visa Court.



## 9-11 Oaklands Street, Alexandra Hills

Ava Terraces is the name of the 13-town house project that has been architecturally designed for 9-11 Oaklands Street and is expected to deliver an example of high standard housing for the Alexandra Hills community.

The demolition work at the site is now complete, with an operational works application to be lodged shortly. Construction is expected to start in August.

Creation Homes will build the townhouses.

Information about the construction phase will be communicated to immediate residents and the community garden operator soon.

## Other news

A \$45,000 revamp will keep the Alexandra Hills Community Hall in good stead.
