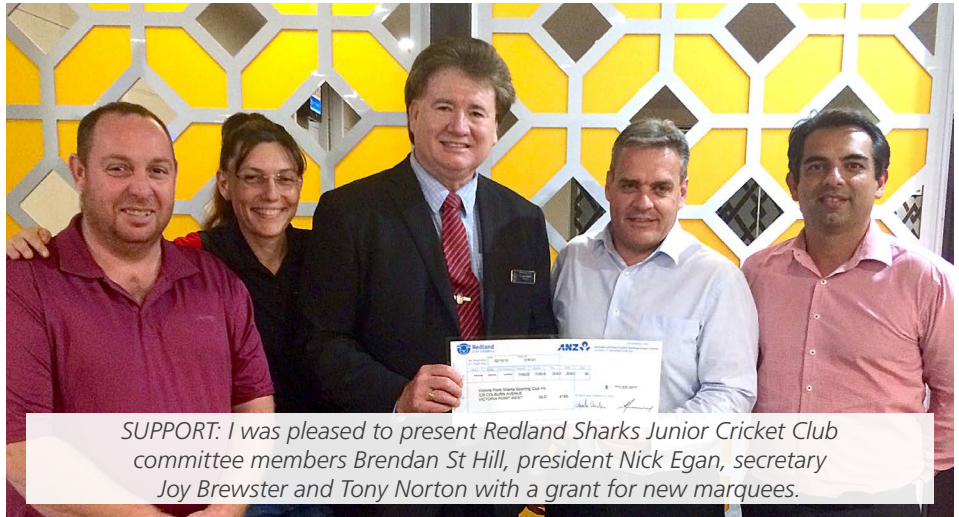
### Helping hand for community groups

Big things are on the way for South East Thornlands Park, pictured above.

Following feedback from residents, a range of features are being considered for the park, including a multi-age playground, small skate park and BMX track, basketball court and fitness station. There has also been support for a picnic area which can

cater for large groups and an open grass area, along with the usual amenities.

A dog off-leash area and community garden may also be provided for in a future stage, pending community interest and funding. Community feedback will shape the final design, so please let me know your ideas for this space.

There is no means testing or waiting lists. Frozen meals are also available for weekends.

The amazing team of volunteers provide a smile, a quick chat and a regular check-in on our customers' general wellbeing, which is why we believe we are more than just a meal service.





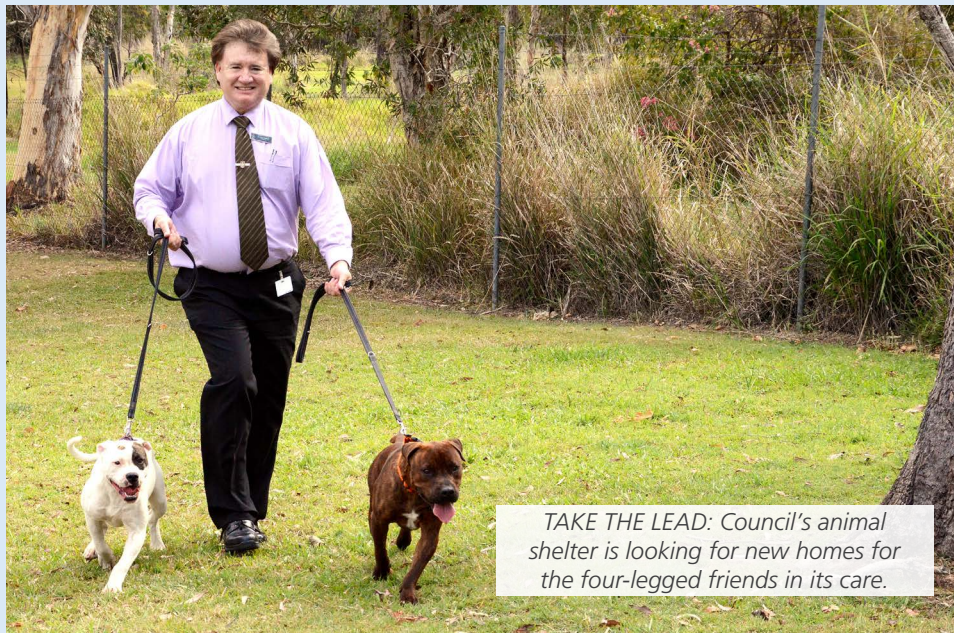
## Caring for our four-legged friends

Our animal rehoming team has been doing a wonderful job finding loving families for unwanted dogs, cats and other animals.

As the councillor responsible for animal management and the adoption program, I have been very heartened by the community's response to their efforts since Council took over the rehoming of animals in May after the RSPCA was no longer in a position to accept our unclaimed animals.

It was determined that we should establish our own program to find new homes for these pets and we created extra accommodation for dogs and new cat enclosures.

A Facebook page was established and the adoption team formed, along with a volunteer program. Staff are also working on a foster care program. In that time our dedicated animal adoption staff have found new homes for 36 cats and 37 dogs, with another 23 animals going to rescue agencies.

We have lots of potential furry friends at the shelter looking for new homes, so if you are looking for a new pet please check out the shelter and the loveable lot featured on its website. You will also find information on how you can volunteer.

All of our animals have had health and behaviour checks, are desexed
