Economic transition

Council is working with the State Government to ensure Straddie can smoothly transition from sand mining to a sustainable economy.

A range of projects are currently with the State Government for consideration but in the meantime Council has completed the Point Lookout boardwalk and is continuing with the signage project on the island, both of which promise significant benefits for tourism. The success of the recent Quandamooka Festival also underscored the value of indigenous cultural heritage to the island.

While the State has pledged \$20 million over five years to develop the North Stradbroke Island Economic Strategy, Council believes the priorities need to be established now and the money allocated to give islanders surety for the future. I will keep you posted on the developments.

New top for Amity road

Amity Point's Sovereign Road, between Dugong Street and the beginning of the gravel access beach track, has been fully reconstructed as part of North Stradbroke Island's roads program.

The work followed numerous pavement failures along this stretch and has involved removing the old bitumen seal, adding 200mm of new gravel pavement and the application of a new two-coat bitumen seal.

All up, about 6000m² of the existing road has been reconstructed. At the time of writing, the job was on track to be completed by about now.

Thank you for your patience during construction but the wait has been well worth it.

Island residents have had two opportunities to talk with Council planning team members about the draft City Plan.

The sessions at Dunwich and Point Lookout were good opportunities to learn more about the process, ask questions and air any concerns about City Plan, as well as other pressing issues.

Transport, the management of erosion-prone areas and the twin issues of property and vegetation management when it comes to dealing with fire risks were among themes to emerge, along with a desire to preserve the island's character through an island-specific development code.

Thank you to all who attended and had input into this important planning document. Members of the City Plan team also met with respresentatives of the Stradbroke Island Management Organisation to provide a City Plan briefing.

Consultation on Junner Street parking proposal

Community consultation on a proposed amendment to the City's subordinate local laws which would allow Council to regulate and enforce parking conditions at the Junner Street ferry terminal, Dunwich, will wind up on 25 November.

Stradbroke Ferries asked for Council's help to manage parking issues at this key location for island commuters.

To ensure your views are considered, you will need to make a formal submission.

Toondah update

The Walker Group has been busy working with specialists in urban planning, design and the environment to prepare a concept masterplan for Toondah Harbour's revitalisation.

By the end of the year it is expected that Walker will refer the project to the Commonwealth Minister for the Environment under the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act and apply to the Coordinator General for a coordinated project declaration. During the environmental impact assessment process, there will be opportunities for residents to have their say on the project plans.
