Budget allows for significant works

Council's \$275 million Budget includes provision for a significant program of works throughout Division 4.

Prime among them will be the installation of an A-line seawall along the Thompson Esplanade, renewal of existing seawalls and replenishment of the beach.

This \$1 million project will also include the relocation of stormwater infrastructure.


The project at Thompson Esplanade, pictured, will be undertaken in stages over three years, with stage one starting this financial year.

Also provided for is the renewal of the seawall at Wilson Esplanade, Victoria Point, along with beach sand replenishment and the installation of a beach access ramp.

This \$80,000 project will be designed this financial year ready for construction the following year.

More than \$712,000 has been earmarked for the Coochiemudlo Island foreshore project.

The Orana Street Park playground at Victoria Point will also get a \$278,000 upgrade, among a range of works.



Community footy is back at Victoria Point!

who normally would not have had that chance."

The club has appointed Rod Brown as senior coach. Brown comes to the club from the Wynnum Football Club, where he played and coached more than 400 games.






Meet and greets
