Council news

- A number of residents have been asking about Cleveland Point.
 Works will be finished there in February 2013. These will include upgrades to the footpath and furniture for the plinth and footpath areas.
- A number of other works are in progress and you will see these happening in your neighbourhood over the next few months:
 - construction of a 2m wide concrete footpath from Bay Street to the existing path in Trinity Court
 - intersection improvements at Smith and Long Streets, Cleveland (install splitter islands, signs, linemarking and lighting).
- A number of residents signed a petition to have turf remediation done at GJ Walter Dog Park. This work was originally scheduled for

- this financial year and it has been pleasing to be able to meet this request so expeditiously.
- Residents will also be pleased to know that the CSIRO site has been tenanted. Council is receiving commercial return rental income on that property so it has proven to be a good purchase.
- Council continues to push the State Government to partner with us in planning for the Toondah Harbour precinct and I look forward to hearing that the current State Government will honour the previous State Government's commitment and take a lead planning role.
- The Redlands has also been recently named Queensland's Most Sustainable City for the second time in three years by Keep Australia Beautiful Queensland. This is great recognition of a number of initiatives that Council has put in place.
