As your newly elected councillor for Division 3 (South Cleveland and Thornlands), I would like to thank you for your support at the recent local election.

I really appreciated all those people who braved what was one of the wettest days on record, and took the time to vote and to have their say.

I am a proud long term resident of Redlands and I am excited about the opportunity to serve the community, in particular, the residents of South Cleveland and Thornlands. We live in a very special place in the world, and it is my goal to protect everything that we love about living here, whilst continually looking for ways to enhance our community so that it remains an attractive place to live.

One of my concerns leading into the election was the spike in illegal dumping caused by the introduction of tip fees. Since being in Council, I have supported the removal of tip fees and am proud to say that this has now been achieved. Residents will now be able to responsibly dispose of their waste at the tip without having to pay a fee.

For all those people who have been waiting and wondering what was going on with the intersection at Pinklands, I am happy to report that

Council will start working on a \$1.35 million upgrade.

Council's 2012-13 budget has been expedited for this long awaited project, which will include a new entrance, a car park upgrade that will extend and replace the current informal graded car park with a 190-bay sealed car park, and will include five bays for persons with disabilities.

Three new, hard-court netball courts will be added to the existing six, making Pinklands a more attractive venue for a range of events including Netball Queensland endorsed events.

I feel it a privilege to represent the residents of South Cleveland and Thornlands and it is a responsibility that I do not take lightly.
