The project will commence in December with a workshop on North Stradbroke Island involving representatives of OzFish, delegates from the Malacological Society of Australasia and researchers from leading universities across QLD and NSW to share knowledge and practical information about the ecology of oyster reefs and their restoration.</p>	\$5,970
