

Launching Boats from Home Beach & Cylinder Beach on North Stradbroke Island

Standard Terms and Conditions

Access Points – Home Beach and Cylinder Beach, Point Lookout, NSI



1. The Boat Launching Permit is issued pursuant to Redland City Council Local Law 1 (*Administration*) 2015, Subordinate Local Law 1.16 (*Bringing or Driving a Motor Vehicle onto a Local Government Controlled Area*) 2015, Local Law No. 4 and Subordinate Local Law No 4 (*Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads*) 2015.
2. The Boat Launching Permit is granted subject to compliance with the standard permit conditions.
3. The Boat Launching Permit Holder shall at all times observe and obey all statutes, laws and regulations, and will comply with any directions from Redland City Council.
4. Boat Launching Permits are valid from 01 January to 31 December each calendar year.
5. The permit holder must be a permanent resident or own property on North Stradbroke Island. If the permit holder ceases to reside or is no longer a NSI property owner, this Boat Launching permit will be cancelled.
6. If the business, vessel/s or vehicle/s are sold, the Permit Holder shall surrender this permit and advise Redland City Council as soon as possible.
7. Boat Launching Permits are NOT transferrable.
8. Access with a motor vehicle to the park or reserve is only permitted through designated access points (see map).
9. Access onto the park or reserve is only permitted for the immediate launching or retrieval of a boat. Such access is to be undertaken in the most direct manner applicable. No parking of vehicles or trailers is permitted on Cylinder Beach at any time.
10. All regulatory signs erected by Redland City Council must be complied with at all times (for example, access restrictions).
11. The current year permit boat launching sticker MUST be displayed on the vehicle, vessel and trailer at all times whilst accessing the beach.
12. In the event of loss or damage to the permit sticker, replacement permit stickers will be provided on request.
13. Vehicles and trailers must be positioned in a manner not to obstruct through traffic, and that occupants can alight the vehicle in a safe manner.
14. Boats must not be launched or retrieved between or within a 20 metre distance outside the bathing flags.
15. Access to Home and Cylinder Beaches is not permitted during Queensland public and school holidays

17. Vehicles and trailers must not be driven within 1 metre of the base of the frontal dune, or on any dune vegetation, at all stages of the tide.
18. Vehicles entering, leaving and driving on the beach must travel at a speed no greater than 10km per hour.
19. Driving on the beaches one hour before and one hour after the high tide is not permitted.
20. All relevant provisions of the Transport Operation (Road Use Management) Act 1995 must be observed.
21. All Boat Launching Permit Holders must hold current marine and drivers licences.
22. The permit holder must not engage in activities that may result in the harm to human health or safety, property damage or loss of amenity, nuisance, obstruction of vehicular or pedestrian traffic, environmental harm and/or environmental nuisance.
23. If the reserve, beach or park structures are damaged by the permit holder, the permit holder will be liable for all costs associated with the repair, restoration or replacement of the park, reserve, equipment or structures.
24. The permit holder shall indemnify Redland City Council from all responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused either directly or indirectly in connection with this permit to the full extent permitted under law.
25. Redland City Council collects your personal information in order to issue this permit. The information will only be used by authorised Council Officers for the purpose of this permit and ensuring our records are accurate.
26. The permit holder's information will not be given to any other person or agency unless you have given Redland City Council permission or Council is required by law to do so.
27. If the information you have provided is insufficient or incorrect, we reserve the right to cancel the permit.

Failure to comply with any of these conditions may be an offence under Local Law 1 (Administration) 2015, Section 6, and may result in an infringement notice being issued and/or the permit being terminated or suspended. Infringements may apply to a maximum of 50 penalty units.
