Prevention of loss of bee colonies in Redland City from Varroa Destructor Mite invasion	This project is aimed at establishing a Varroa Destructor identification and elimination resource centre, based in the field apiary of the Bayside Beekeepers Association. The purpose of the resource centre is to ensure that, should the Varroa Mite come into Redland City, that it is identified and contained as quickly as possible so that our bees and the environment can be preserved. This resource centre would provide materials, kits, and resources to all beekeepers (both those who are currently registered with Queensland Biosecurity as well as those hobbyists who have not registered their hives), as well as the general public who may be aware of the presence of feral hives located in bushland within Redland City as well as bee swarms which may come into Redland City from other areas.	\$3,000.00
PS-231-010	LifeFlight Foundation	'First Minute Matters' - Community Trauma Training	Often the first person on the scene of an emergency is someone at the scene - a coworker, parent, babysitter, sibling, or even a stranger who witnessed an accident. LifeFlight emergency crews have identified these members of the general community, who unexpectedly may find themselves first on scene at a traumatic incident could, with the right knowledge and skills, provide immediate beneficial care responses in preparation for the arrival of LifeFlight or other emergency service responders which result in better patient outcomes. The LifeFlight 'First Minute Matters' program will address this need by providing critical safety training and education to bystanders on how to respond when an emergency happens. The types of medical emergencies that require immediate attention include cardiac arrest, cuts and burns, overdose, traumatic injury due to a fall or motor vehicle accident, or exposure to an allergen. Our application seeks funding to run three (3) face-to-face workshops (approximately 20 participants at each) in the Redland City region in February 2023. The workshops are delivered by our highly qualified Trauma Training Program Manager from the LifeFlight Training Academy in Brisbane.	\$2,440.00

This project will provide a pair of required school shoes for approximately 350-450, or possibly more, local children from prep to year 12. These children, without our support, would otherwise not have access to new shoes for the start of the school year. This project will assist in alleviating financial burden for parents at a costly time of year.	\$10,000.00
PS-231-018	Play It Forward (Aust) Ltd	Rock Choir 2023	Play It Forward's ROCK CHOIR project is a unique access and inclusion program that aims to engage singers of all ages and demographics from the Redland Bay community who might not normally sing in a formalised choir setting, along with professional development opportunities for trained music teachers and conductors, to come together and prepare a concert of popular rock hit classics. Under the direction of Play It Forward's award-winning artistic director, and supported by a team of outstanding local professional musicians and arts administration practitioners, ROCK CHOIR will enable the singers to work together over 8 weeks of workshops that will culminate in a public community performance in the Redland Bay's preeminent concert hall at Redland Performing Arts Centre.	\$5,000.00





PS-231-019	Mental Health in the Redlands	Top Blokes Foundation (TBF) is requesting funding to ensure we can continue to deliver our program at Victoria Point YMCA. This grant will allow us to positively impact the mental-health and wellbeing of 24 vulnerable young males through the delivery of our 6-month mentoring and social education program. TBF's proven approach develops young men's resilience, empathy and respect for self and others, and in doing so improves young male mental health for 83% of participants, antisocial behavior for 72% and increases engagement to education for 79%.	\$10,000.00
