Cleveland town centre gardens blooming

The Cleveland Town Centre has been getting a spruce up with upgrades to the gardens and streetscapes starting at the roundabout at Bloomfield and Queen streets.

The work has included removing outdated hedges at crossings to improve vision for both pedestrians and vehicles.

Fresh mulch has been added to garden beds, with plants added that are low maintenance and attract birds.

You also may have noticed the addition of sandstone blocks as feature pieces.

Ahead of Christmas, some pavement areas will also get a clean.

Council is also working with the shopping centres on their streetscapes.

Once these works have been completed, the team will begin working at Cleveland Harbour.

Cleveland Local Area Transport update

Council will be seeking feedback from businesses, workers, visitors and the community on the draft Local Area Transport Plan for Cleveland Town Centre in the first half of next year.

A strategy document that communicates the main directions and priorities for the CBD transport system is currently being prepared.

Once the feedback on the draft plan is in, Council will be aiming to finalise it around mid-year.

The aim of the plan is to provide guidance over the next 20 years for managing the land use and transport system to ensure Cleveland evolves into a vibrant, active mixed-use centre.

Indigenous mural making a difference

The mural by Quandamooka artist Joshua Gross at the Cleveland's Bloomfield Street underpass has transformed the area.

The young aspiring artist from North Stradbroke Island (Minjerribah) has a strong desire to use his talents to create public artwork for the community.

The Bloomfield Street underpass provided a great space and opportunity for Joshua to develop his art profile and share his Quandamooka heritage and creativity.

The commission has had plenty of positive feedback and brightens up this popular commuter area. It is also another small step forward in understanding and reconciliation. The street art initiative is part of a range of Council strategies to combat vandalism within our community.

With the Bloomfield Street underpass having sustained damage from graffiti and past wet weather events, it was time to

see new artwork in this location. An antigraffiti coating helps to protect Joshua's amazing work.

Council to livestream statutory meetings

Residents will be able to see their local Council in action more easily next year, when all statutory meetings will be livestreamed.

This will eliminate geographic and social barriers which may prevent people from attending meetings. It is also an opportunity to better understand Council operations and get to know all of the city's Councillors.

Since 27 June 2012, all statutory meetings of Council have been recorded, with the recording available on Council's website within a couple of days. From January next year, our meetings will still be uploaded to the website but you will also be able to watch proceedings as they are occurring online.

More details will be provided ahead of the first meeting for 2023, on Wednesday 25 January.

Grants and sponsorship helping community

I was pleased to see that a number of Cleveland community organisations have received support under Council's various grants programs.

Well done to these organisations for being pro-active in making our area such a great place to live.

The grants have supported a range of deserving local groups such as Bayside Community Radio Association, for illuminating the poinciana trees in Bloomfield Street, and Redland City Bands for its Band in the Park project at Raby Bay, along with events such as the Queensland Triathlon Series, Cleveland Caravan, Camping, Boating & 4×4 Expo, Greazefest, Surf Life Saving Queensland's Kozii Ironman Challenge and the Young Entrepreneur Summit.

Other grants have supported the Redland Museum, local environmental projects and sports clubs such as Redlands Touch Association, Redlands United Football Club and Redlands Hockey Association.

Our exceptional STAR Community Services, which does so much to assist our community, has also been a beneficiary of grants, along with Redland Hospital Auxiliary, Fun Farm Ltd, Life Education Centre Foundation Queensland, U3A Redlands District, Redlands Orchid Society and the QCWA Redland branch.



CBD parking update

In October, Council moved to make changes to Cleveland centre parking that balances the access needs of businesses, visitors, workers and commuters.

These changes are being implemented as we approach Christmas and information about them will be posted on Council's website and other channels, as well as being widely distributed to businesses, Council's Customer Service Centres and other destinations in Cleveland Town Centre.

Toondah parking boost

Redland City Council has been opening up free extra temporary car parking at Toondah Harbour to help those travelling to Straddie during busy periods.

The overflow areas, off Wharf Street and at the other side of the carpark, will be available from 19 December 2022 to 31 January 2023 for the summer holiday season, including Australia Day, as well as next Easter and through the school holidays in April, the ANZAC and Labour Day public holidays and the September school holidays including the King's Birthday holiday. The extra parking will also be available for major Straddie events.

This is good for locals, businesses and visitors at peak periods and I thank Council and the State Government for what is a sensible outcome
