

Public transport

Public transport with frequent convenient services to Cleveland includes:

- trains every 15 minutes on the Cleveland line at peak times
- direct bus services linking Redland's key centres, e.g. the 250 runs every 20 minutes at peak times, taking 20 minutes from Capalaba to Cleveland and 16 minutes from Victoria Point to Cleveland.

Commuters from Cleveland

If you park at Cleveland Station to catch the train into work, you might have more luck finding a carpark at a nearby station. Ormiston Station is only three to four minutes away and often has unoccupied carparks.

Alternatively, it could be quicker to walk or ride to the bus stop or train station. You can now take your bike or scooter on the train and access bike racks and lockers at the train station.

Cleveland parking and access guide

Your easy reference to parking in Cleveland centre

January 2023



Cleveland is a vibrant, mixed-use centre, attracting a wide range of visitors. Redland City Council works hard to ensure the parking available provides a balance of differing zones to meet the needs of all users.

This guide provides hints and tips to help Cleveland businesses, visitors, workers and commuters find parking in Cleveland that suits them and suggests other ways to access the centre to avoid parking issues.

Using this guide

There are many parking and travel options for workers, businesses and customers who visit Cleveland centre including:

- quick turnaround, short-medium duration parking
- 12-hour (12P) and longer duration parking zones
- motorcycle parking
- bike racks (which can also be used for e-scooters)
- privately owned off-street car parks
- parking for people with a disability
- parking for people with prams
- electrical vehicle charging stations.



Tips for all-day parking

Customers/visitors

Cleveland has a range of public parking spaces to meet the needs of businesses and customers, with parking times ranging from 15 minutes to three hours on Middle, Bloomfield and Doig streets and parts of Queen Street.

There are also about 2,000 long duration (12-hour or more) spaces, 70 per cent of which are privately owned and available for businesses, their customers and staff. Most are behind the premises they belong to.

If you have an appointment with a business in Cleveland, why not ask if they have off-street parking?

Centre workers

If you work locally, parking in the centre of Cleveland can be tight.

Some workers park in three-hour zones and 'space-hop' during the day, moving to another three-hour zone before their time is up to avoid fines.

There is plenty of 12-hour parking available within a couple of blocks of the centre of Cleveland in Russell, Queen, Homer or Wynyard streets.

By parking in these locations, spaces can be freed up for customers and visitors.

In the long run, it is less time consuming than having to move your car in the middle of the day or risking a parking fine.

Parking a five minute walk from your destination could increase your daily step count by 650 steps each way.

Walking and riding

Have you considered leaving the car at home and using other ways to get to work?

Walking or riding to work can be fun, improve your wellbeing and frees up parking as well as being environmentally friendly.

There are also bike/scooter racks in Cleveland and lockers at Cleveland Station that can be booked online. See 'Travelling with your bike' on Queensland Rail's website.

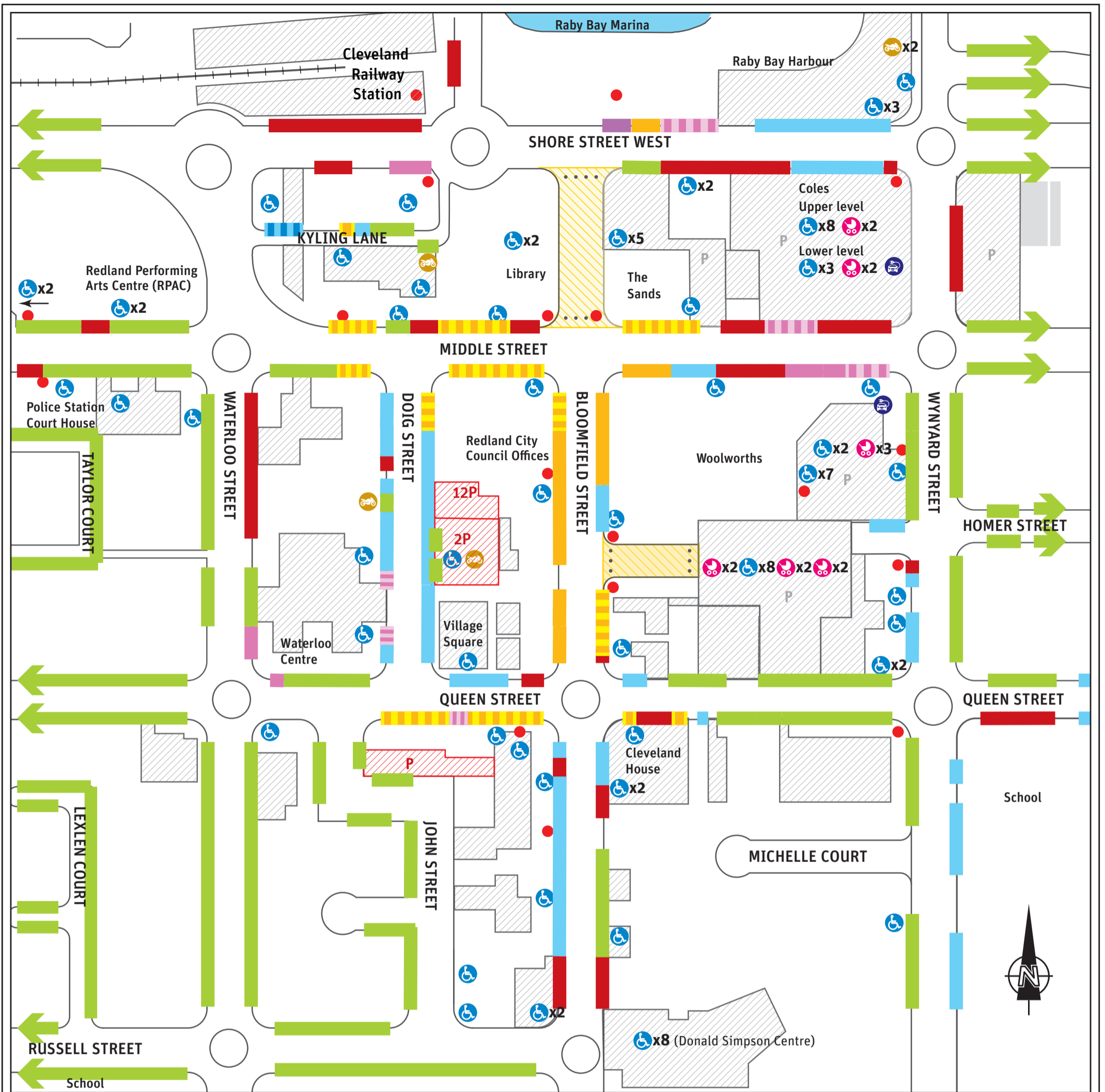
Other forms of travel
