CS-232-006	Ms Lucy Blaber	Native Bird Rehabilitation in the Redlands I am a bird carer, predominantly for precocial chicks, e.g. ducklings, plovers and curlews. I am applying for additional facilities to increase survival rates, accommodate a greate number of birds, at different stages of their growth and development, and provide better continuity of care, so that birds do not have to be transferred between multiple carers and/o leave the Redlands prior to their release.	
CS-232-009	Ocean Crusaders Foundation LTD	A four-day program to clean up the coast of the Bay Islands connected to Redlands. Our team will head out in our 7m custom built landing craft with up to 6 people on board for a cleanup of epic proportions. On average we remove 1.2 tonne of debris in a day and clean ups in the region previously conducted under other grants and corporate funding have seen these amount easily reached.	
CS-232-010	Ms Melissa Kling	Wildlife Carer Support - Intensive care unit In order to rehabilitate sick, injured, diseased and orphaned wildlife, especially those that cannot self-regulate their own body temperature, intensive care units are required. By regulating their body temperature, it increases chance of survival to the already vulnerable wildlife in the Quandamooka Country, Redlands. The additional expense of an ICU to the service, costs and time I already volunteer is not usually affordable. However, with Redlands Council supporting my application, I will be able to purchase an intensive care unit to broader the survival rate of our native Australian wildlife. By doing so, it contributes to a sustainable environment and helps support a robust living culture in the Redlands.	d
