Christmas back under stars

A Christmas tradition on Redlands Coast returns to its original format and location this year.

Christmas by Starlight will be held on Saturday 16 December, from 3pm to 8.30pm, at Norm Price Park – Redland Showgrounds, Cleveland.

For the past three years, the event had been subject to restrictions brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic and had been a ticketed event held over five days at Raby Bay Harbour Park.

This year it returns to its original popular location at the showgrounds and will be free to all with no tickets required.

There will be live entertainment, free rides, Christmas merchandise stalls,



food trucks, a visit from Santa Claus and Christmas carolling.

Earlier in the month, the annual Lighting of the Christmas Tree will be held from 5pm to 8.30pm on Friday 1 December at Raby Bay Harbour Park, Cleveland. There will be free live entertainment, photos with Santa, a Christmas movie in the park, and the official lighting of the tree. It is a free event with no tickets required.

Percy Ziegenfusz Park in Thornlands is undergoing a makeover.

The spruce-up of the popular park in Seqoia Street started in October and will include some fun new equipment and some fresh new landscaping.

Playground equipment being installed includes a play unit, parrot rocker,

double swing, ball maze panel, and soccer goal. It will also have a rubber and sand softfall area, sandstone seating blocks, and other landscape features such as topsoil and turf. It is hopeful that the upgrade will be finished in time for Christmas, with a completion date of 15 December, weather permitting.
