Park projects and upgrades continue to roll out

The solar lighting program in Windemere Road Park will be expanded as part of Council's Community Infrastructure Program.

More solar lighting will improve the safety and extend the usable hours of the dog off-leash area and park.

Under the program, we will also be installing picnic table seating in Sevenoaks Street Park. Through the 2023-2024 Capital Works program, Lorikeet Drive Park and Crotona Road West Park will be receiving upgrades as well.

Local organisations benefit from **Councillor grants**

Over the past year, several community groups have benefited from a Councillor's Community Benefit grant which has enabled them to purchase items such as battery-powered tools, sports jerseys, medals for presentation days, computers, and events.

Christmas back under the stars

A Christmas tradition on Redlands Coast returns to its original format and location this year.

Christmas by Starlight will be held on Saturday 16 December 2023, from 3pm to 8.30pm, at Norm Price Park -Redland Showgrounds, Cleveland.

For the past three years, the event had been subject to restrictions brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic and had been a ticketed event held over five days at Raby Bay Harbour Park.

This year it returns to its original popular location at the showgrounds and will be free to all with no tickets required.

There will be live entertainment, free rides, Christmas merchandise stalls, food trucks, a visit from Santa Claus and Christmas carolling.

Meanwhile, the annual Redlands Coast Lighting of the Christmas Tree will be held from 5pm to 8.30pm on Friday 1 December at Raby Bay Harbour Park, Cleveland. It is also a free event with no tickets required.

Temporary pedestrian path

Through the advocacy efforts of both the community and myself, Council has constructed a temporary pedestrian connection along Kinross Road between Boundary Road and Lathro Way.
