PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to seek Council resolution to;

- award a construction contract over \$2,000,000 (including GST)
- to delegate authority to the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to make, vary and discharge the contract for project PDG-40015-2 Moreton Bay Cycleway Section 1 (Cameron Court to School Road) – Victoria Point.

BACKGROUND

Procurement for this project was undertaken in accordance with section 228 Tender process of the Local Government Regulation 2012, and Council's Corporate Policy POL-3043.

Council invited tenders from the open market for the supply, delivery and construction of the Moreton Bay Cycleway Section 1 (Cameron Court to School Road) at Victoria Point.

The tender was advertised in the Redland City Bulletin on Wednesday 6 March 2019 and closed on Tuesday 9 April 2019. The Evaluation process is nearing completion with the final due diligence checks due early May 2019.

This report recommends that Council accepts the tender and make, vary and discharge a contract up to the value of

for project PDG-40015-2.

ISSUES

It is essential that Section 1 of the MBC Victoria Point (Cameron Court to School Road) commences construction in the FY 18/19 as this is an approved CAPEX commitment and forms part of the Agreement Cycle Network Local Government Grants Program between Redland City Council and the Department of Transport and Main Roads (DTMR).

STRATEGIC IMPLICATIONS

Legislative Requirements

Procurement for this project has been undertaken in accordance with section 228 Tender process of the *Local Government Regulation 2012,* and Council's Corporate Policy POL-3043 Corporate Procurement, which establish clear standards for financial management and the changes outlined in this report do not put Council at risk of non-compliance.

Risk Management

Non delivery or deferral of projects would put Council at risk of not meeting the funding agreement with DTMR for this project.

Contractor risk

All construction risks have been identified through Council's risk assessment process, managed by Project Delivery Group (PDG). Proposed Workplace Health and Safety (WHS) and traffic management plans and other evaluation criterion identified by PDG officers were requested at the time of procurement. The preferred Contractor has met the criterion.

Appropriate Corporate Scorecard Financial and Performance Assessment reports have been sought to ensure Alder Constructions Pty Ltd have financial capacity to undertake the contract. Council's risk of liability and measures will also be taken to mitigate any risk (where identified).

Risk mitigation includes two contractor bank cheques/bank guarantees and a Council appointed Superintendent to validate payment claims and contractor performance.

Financial

The Coordination Committee Meeting Minutes dated 23 October 2013 recommended that, under Section 257 of the *Local Government Act 2009,* Council delegate authority to the CEO, power to authorise expenditure on behalf of Council up to \$2,000,000.00 if the expenditure is:

- a) in accordance with all legislative requirements;
- b) in accordance with all policy requirements;
- c) is funded from Council's approved annual budget.

The total contract amount exceeds \$2,000,000.00 including GST, which is above the CEO's financial delegation limits and conditions, and therefore requires submission to Council for approval.

The FY18/19 and FY19/20 CAPEX project budget allocated for the project by Council under the Moreton Bay Cycleway (MBC) Program is as follows:
